RE-REGISTRATION

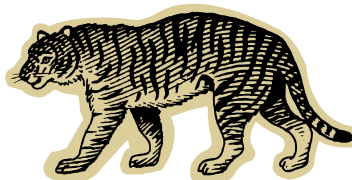

MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a clergy man and a Civil Rights Leader. He was the recipient of the 1964 Nobel Peace Prize for his leadership in working to bring about social, political and economic equality for Blacks through non-violent means. Dr. King achieved a number of successes in the 1950's and 1960's for his cause by combining peaceful mass action against racial discrimination and segregation with an appeal to his followers to bear no malice against those who opposed human and civil rights for all citizens. On August 28, 1963, Dr. Martin Luther King captured the spirit of the Civil Rights Movement with his "I Have a Dream" speech before over 250,000 people assembled in Washington DC, the largest civil rights demonstration in history.

Violence cut Dr. King's mission short when an assassin shot and killed him on April 4, 1968. In November, 1983, President Ronald Regan signed a bill designating the 3rd Monday in January as an official federal holiday to honor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
